Dr. Mark E. Campbell has joined the Cardiology team at Stone County Hospital and Clinic. Dr. Campbell has numerous accomplishments.

He received degrees from the University of Mississippi Medical Center (1996), Delta State University (1992) and Mississippi State University (1989). He also completed an internship (1997) and residency (1999) in Internal Medicine at Keesler Medical Center, and a fellowship in Cardiology at Wilford Hall Medical Center (2002). Later, he went to Duke University Medical Center for a fellowship in Interventional Cardiology, completing it in 2003.

During his medical career, Dr. Campbell has made numerous presentations and publications, many of which have been presented to the medical societies of the United

States Air Force. In addition, he has had the honor of serving in numerous leadership positions, including Director of the Trauma ICU in Balad, Iraq; Chief of the Cardiology Department, Director of Interventional Cardiology and Director of Research/Department of Cardiology at Keesler Medical Center; and Director of Advanced Cardiac Life Support Training, also at Keesler Medical Center. Dr. Campbell was awarded the Air Force Achievement Medal in 1999, the Army Achievement Medal in 1990 and was awarded the American Legion Scholarship Award in 1992.

Dr. Campbell is a member of the American College of Cardiology, the American College of Physicians, the American Medical Association, the Society of Air Force Physicians and the Society of Cardiac Angiography and Interventions (SCAI). He has board certifications in the state of Mississippi and Louisiana, and is also certified in Internal Medicine, Cardiovascular Disease and Interventional Cardiology by the American Board of Internal Medicine.
